CONCLUSIONS

- Nearly 20% of respondents feel insecure as a consequence of social exclusion (claiming to be judged because of their low grades they get at school)
- The reasons of social exclusion are perceived as low grades at school and only 3% indirectly indicated the social status of the students' families;
- Almost 4% of the respondents are not happy in school but they didn't mention the reason (could be anything related to their state of health, state of social health, special needs, lack of integration, etc).
- Most sources of exclusion in school arise because of the social perceptions of educational actors and not only.
- 97% of respondents consider themselves happy in school which is a great feedback of the actions our school take for decreasing social exclusion.
