## Final Conclusions

In conclusion, according to the participants in the survey, who are all aged from 15 to 18 years old, dropping out of school is not a common phenomenon. However the seriousness of the problem cannot be denied. The reasons behind the choice of a student to abandon school could be a result of their experiences in the educational environment, such as getting bullied, the rare application of school rules, the difficult courses and exams or the opinion that is cultivated amongst the student body that school cannot provide them with the means to have a comfortable future. Other external reasons could be the pressure that the students are under because of their parents' expectations or family problems.
